THOUGHT FOR 5th Sunday of LENT (16/17th March): What a paradox! Unless the seed goes below ground into the darkness of the soil, it $S \leftarrow S$ will never see the light of day. So too for the Christian: to give away is to possess, to serve is to lead, to put ourselves last is to be first, DES and to die to self is to live life to the full. In the final weeks of Lent BEARS we are faced once more with the seeming foolishness of Christ's message, but which is the highest wisdom for those who believe.





First Reading: (Jer 31:31-34). The prophet tells a shattered people that God has not forsaken them, but will soon make a new covenant with them.

Second Reading: (Heb 5:7-9). Through his obedience and suffering, Christ became the source of eternal life for us.

Gospel: (In 12:20-33). In his death Jesus will be glorified and this will bring life to those who follow him.

THOUGHT FOR PALM SUNDAY (23rd/24th March): Today we begin a week's journey with Christ through suffering to death and onto glory. The liturgy of the Holy Week starts today with our palm-procession of triumph and follows the route of service to others (Maundy Thursday), dying to sin (Good Friday) and living new life (Easter). How will we spend this week? Will it be business as usual or will we reach out to deepen our faith and commitment to Jesus and so share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection?





First Reading: (Is 50:4-7). The prophet suffers in carrying out his mission, but is sustained by the firm belief that God will not abandon him.

Second Reading: (Phil 2:6-11). Because Jesus took on himself our human condition, and accepted death on a cross, the Father has raised him up and made him Lord of Heaven and earth.

Gospel: (Mk 14:1-15:47). St Mark stresses the crude trial and shocking details of Jesus' suffering.


